Project staff training

Managing a dredging project requires specific skills and knowledge. The objective of the project staff training is to improve the capabilities of project staff such as superintendents, project engineers etc. The interactive course covers the tools and techniques required to guide a project.

Who is this course suitable for?

The Project staff training is designed to improve the knowledge and skills of project engineers, superintendents and project managers with at least three years of experience in dredging. To take part, participants should have a medium level of technical education.

Training topics

The course will give insight on the following topics:

- different dredging applications within ports, rivers, and coastal areas, such as maintenance dredging, capital dredging and environmental dredging
- dredging equipment types and boundaries for their use
- cutter suction and trailing suction hopper dredger layout and components
- practical aspects of dredging operations
- fundamentals of hydraulic transportation and dredge pumps
- scoping site conditions, for example soil characteristics, environmental aspects and meteorological condition
- dredge project phases, including identification, investigation, feasibility studies, design, construction and maintenance
- dredge project management, including costs and contracts.



Learning goals

- set-up dredging projects and optimise running dredging projects
- calculate and interpret the cost of dredging projects based on industry standards
- perform risk analyses
- set-up the overall and financial planning
- know how to follow up a dredging project.

Training method

A mix of of presentations, technical lectures, discussions and group assignments will be carried out during the training program.

Course material

Participants will receive the training content digitally.

Certificate

Attendees will receive a certificate of attendance following completion of the training.

Language

English.

Duration

The training takes five full days.

Location

The training is held either digitally or at the Royal IHC construction yard in Kinderdijk, the Netherlands.

Training fee

The fee for this training is € 3,000,- per person. Full payment of the training fee must be received at least four weeks before the start of the course. 21% VAT is applicable to training provided in the Netherlands. (*This fee includes tuition, literature, lunch, and refreshments during all training days. Not included are costs such as transportation, hotel accommodation, meals, etc.*)
